Included in budget line 620, Budgeted Withdrawal from Capital Reserve- Excess Costs & Other Capital Projects is \$300,000 for other capital project costs for the second phase of a door replacement and installation project district-wide. We will be replacing interior and exterior doors throughout the buildings that are in most need of replacement. Funds will also be used for the roof/soffit replacement project at the high school. The total costs of these projects represent expenditures for renovation elements or projects that are in addition to the facilities efficiency standards determined by the Commissioner as necessary to achieve the CCCS.
