BE IT RESOLVED, that the Midland Park Board of Education, County of Bergen, approves the 2020-2021 School Year Budget, as follows:

Included in budget line 620, Budgeted Withdrawal from Capital Reserve- Excess Costs & Other Capital Projects is \$300,000 for other capital project costs to create a Life Skills Classroom at the High School and for lintel renovations at Highland School. The total costs of these projects represent expenditures for renovation elements or projects that are in addition to the facilities efficiency standards determined by the Commissioner as necessary to achieve the CCCS;

and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the GENERAL FUND tax levy \$20,983,476 is approved to support Current General Expense and \$937,475 to support Debt Service, for the 2020-2021 school year budget. Included in the General Fund Tax Levy is the need for a Banked Cap Adjustment in the amount of \$153,163 to be included in the base budget and used to support current programs as well as the purchase of new math textbooks at the elementary level and online textbooks at the secondary level. These purchases will be completed in the 2020-2021 budget year.
