Mr. Nabil Eliya inquired about renting Lower Sunset field. He thought the Board was creating a group to discuss field use and would come up with a plan. He also thought the Board was not renting out the fields any longer.

Mr. Canellas answered that there will be some limits imposed on renting. There will not be any rental of the stadium field. Lower Sunset is being rented out for a few days, for a few hours. We are curtailing the amount of use and are working with the Borough with respect to maintenance of the field.

Mr. Eliya wanted to know what the committee is doing to improve conditions of the fields.

Mr. Canellas answered curbing the use and in discussion with the town to help with the maintenance. Also, reviewing the utilization of the fields – who are the primary users and what fields are used more than the others.

Mr. Eliya also asked what the process is for closing the fields on the week-ends.

Ms. Garvey answered the administration relies on borough and recreation personnel to help with the decision. Then I make the calls to the groups outside of recreation.

Mr. William Guarini, President of the Soccer Association, informed the Board that the association had approved the donation of nets for behind the goal. The donation was approved a year ago and asked for guidance to get the donation to the district. Mr. Thomas mentioned that the issue is how to install and not the accepting of this kind donation.

Mr. Guarini also asked how neighbors of the schools would know about things like the band playing out on the field over the past weekend. Ms. Garvey replied we would not normally announce facility uses, but there was an email sent out to everyone who receives district emails.

Mr. Eliya was curious to know who makes the ultimate decision when it comes to facility usage. There does not seem to be enough time for recreation and other Midland Park programs.

Ms. Garvey explained the process and advised that priority will always be granted to the school.

Mr. Thomas commented that it used to only have recreation programs on the weekends because of the lack of fields. Mr. Canellas reiterated that the District will always maintain that our teams hold priority status, then the town and we will remain committed to allocating the maximum amount of time possible.
