### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

#### **Mission Statement**

#### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT Dr. Marie Cirasella

• I have wonderful news to share with the Board and our community. MPHS Senior Alyssa Cornetta was one of only four winners in the U.S. who won the "Effective School Solutions & Madison Holleran Foundation's Mental Health Action Scholarship!" The award, in the amount of \$2,000, had high school seniors across the country submit essays about mental health support programs they implemented at their high schools.

Alyssa is the founder of THRIVE, an MPHS club that focuses on reducing mental health stigma, normalizing conversations regarding mental health, creating healthy habits, and reducing student stress. Prior to founding this club, Alyssa wrote a mental health column in the school's newspaper and also wrote and broadcasted mental health segments on the MPHS TV station.

Effective School Solutions is the leading provider of school-based mental health services for school districts, the Madison Holleran Foundation are partners in this scholarship program. It was founded to increase suicide prevention awareness and gain feedback from high school students about innovative approaches to help young adults navigate through mental health challenges they are facing today.

The scholarship honors Madison Holleran, an Allendale, NJ native and all-state athlete who died by suicide as a first-year student at the University of Pennsylvania in 2014.

- We are pleased to announce that the summer SOAR Academy will be held again this year, providing in-person acceleration and remediation in Reading, Writing and Mathematics for elementary school students at no cost to school families. In addition, students in Grades 6-12 who have failed a course will be provided with summer remediation options through an online support lab. These labs are supervised by certified teachers and parents will be contacted based on student need.

+15. BE IT RESOLVED that the Midland Park Board of Education "SFA" approves the renewal of the Food Service Management contract with The Pomptonian, Inc. "FSMC" for the food service operation for 2022-2023.

The FSMC shall receive, in addition to the costs of operation, an administrative/management fee of \$0.2054 per reimbursable meal and meal equivalent to compensate the FSMC for administrative and management costs. This fee shall be billed monthly as a cost of operation. The SFA guarantees the payment of such costs and fee to the FSMC.

Total meals are calculated by adding reimbursable meal pattern meals served and meal equivalents. The number of reimbursable meals served to the children shall be determined by actual count. Cash receipts, other than from sales of reimbursable program meals served to the children, shall be divided by \$3.66 to arrive at an equivalent meal count.

The per meal administrative/management fee of \$0.2054 will be multiplied by total meals.
