

2023-2024 Midland Park School District Assessment Information for Parents and General Public

New Jersey school districts, charter schools and renaissance school projects are required by statute (*N.J.S.A. 18A: 7C-6.6*) to annually notify parents or guardians by Oct. 1st of any statewide student assessment or commercially developed assessments that will be administered over the course of the school year.

Key:

- **Number of Testing Administrations in Districts** refers to the number of times a particular assessment will be offered during the school year.
- **Testing Mode** refers to how the student will be administered the assessment. The two modes are computer-based, & paper-and-pencil. Be sure to inquire about the options if your child has a medical issue that would necessitate them to take a paper-and-pencil assessment.
- **Testing Time** is the maximum amount of time allotted to students to complete the assessment.
- **Testing Window** is the period in which districts administer the statewide student assessment. It is not the actual number of days it takes a student to complete the assessment. School districts can choose the specific days within the window to administer the test.
- **Results Available** refers to date districts receive individualized student results from the assessment vendor.
- **Requirement** refers to whether the assessment is required (*Req.*) by state and/or federal (*Fed.*) government, or by the district.
